Romans 8:1-31

Reflect

This weekend Pastor David Grant taught about three questions posed to us in Romans 8 that we each need to answer for ourselves:

1. What then shall we say in response to these things? (Romans 8:31)
 - a. Often there are not black and white answers to many of our spiritual questions. In Romans 8, Paul tells us about life in Christ. After reading Romans 8:1-31, what is your response to the things he says? Do you believe Paul? More importantly, do you believe God?
 - b. What are things Paul writes that you question? Why?
2. If God is for us...? (Romans 8:31)
 - a. Do you believe that God is for you? It's tempting to decide the answer to this question based on our relationships, our experiences, and our life circumstances. But in the tough times, do we believe that God is for us? In the heart aches, heart breaks, and confusing times do we believe this truth?
 - b. When is it hard for you to believe this truth?
3. Who can be against us?
 - a. If you do believe that God is for you, then this question should be an easy answer. But often we feel like the world is against us, even if God is for us. Who do you feel is against you?
 - i. When hard things happen in life and there's no explanation -- when we're most tempted to question God -- we can always go back to the basic truth that God is for us.
 - b. In what situations do you tend to doubt that God is for you? What can you do to remind yourself that He is?
 - c. When you don't understand God's ways, what do you do? How do you seek to understand him?
