## Life Group Questions: Outrageous Faith

### Read

Mark 11:20-25

### Reflect

People who live outrageous lives stand out from the crowd. Who can you think of that you would call “outrageous” in a good way? Jesus was outrageous. He was always saying and doing things that just bugged people. Sometimes he said things that got under their skin, and sometimes he did things that made everyone’s jaw drop. What is something that Jesus said or did that has always bugged you? Why do you think that stands out to you? What about it is outrageous?

Pastor Greg taught us that people who have outrageous faith:

1. See things that others can’t see
  - a. God has made each of us different for a reason. We each reflect different aspects and facets of God’s character and that means that we all see things differently. What do you see that others don’t see?
  - b. Is there a problem, person, or circumstance that you need to start seeing through the eyes of faith? What do you think God wants you to do with the things that you see?
2. Say things that others won’t say
  - a. Jesus didn’t just see differently; he said things that were different. What in your life has God shown you that you need to say out loud? What is he calling you to that you have been afraid to vocalize?
  - b. What would happen if you started saying your goals and dreams out loud? How would that change your attitude and behavior?
3. Do things that others refuse to do
  - a. Spend some time reflecting with your group: what are your next steps? What do you need to do once you’ve learned how to “see” and “say?”
  - b. Some of these things may be scary or difficult. We don’t need to do this all at once, but what first step can you take this week?

What was your biggest take-away from the weekend message?

- What do you feel like God is asking you to do in response to the weekend message? What is your next step?
- How can your Small Group support you and hold you accountable in this?
