Small Group Questions: Part 4: A Blueprint for Wisdom

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Read

Psalms 139:16; James 4:13-15; Acts 9:1-6; Acts 9: 10-19; Galatians 1:15-18

Reflect

Before Saul, became Paul, he was known as a man who persecuted followers of Jesus. Then while approaching Damascus on this mission, Jesus interrupted him to take over authorship of Saul's story. How would you answer this question? The author of my story is_____.

Pastor Josh Surratt highlights three ways we can make God the author of our story:

1. I need to put down my pen.
 - a. In Acts 9:6, Jesus tells Saul to go into the city and wait. How would you react if your leader told you to go and wait?
 - b. What is the difference between the way you view your life and the way God views your life?
2. I need to embrace the other characters.
 - a. Why do we often try to be the only character in our story?
 - b. Through relationship, Saul found vision and strength when Ananias was sent by God to heal Saul. Describe a time in your life that you saw healing through relationships.
3. I need to stay present in my current chapter.
 - a. What keeps you from being present where God has you?
 - b. How can you learn to trust God with your current circumstances, rather than skipping ahead to the next chapter?
 - c. Are there previous chapters of your life that you need to revisit so you can move on to the best part of your story?

Respond: Will you let God be the author of your story? How can your small group support you?
