From the beginning, our heart at Seacoast has been to meet people right where they are, to be a life-giving presence in every community where God has called us. Today, each of our campuses has an impact on their communities, and we are committed to resourcing them to accomplish all that God has called Seacoast to do. That means addressing capacity and facility issues at the campuses that most need attention.

CELEBRATION HIGHLIGHTS:

A total of \$543,998 has been raised for Projects.

- Seacoast *Morning Encouragement* has received over 1 Million views since March 2020.
- Every weekend, an average of 2,300 people attend Seacoast via Youtube.
- At Easter, 35,334 people watched church online via one of 5 live-streaming platforms. A total of 50,035 attended in person and online.
- The new Irmo Campus continues to grow, outpacing their pre-COVID numbers.



VISION PROJECT 1 SUMMERVILLE CAMPUS NEW FACILITY

Prior to COVID-19, Seacoast’s Summerville Campus was bursting at the seams, and we anticipate it will soon experience this again. Large corporations continue to open new facilities and branches in the local area, leading Summerville to become one of the fastest growing towns in South Carolina. Our goal is to have the capacity to provide a church home for this great influx of workers and their families in our community.

- We are looking for a 25 to 35-acre property.
- Based on the rapid growth in the area, we feel Summerville can support multiple campuses. We are considering a variety of areas in and around Summerville that will allow us to serve this diverse and growing community.

Pray that God helps us find the right property to expand our Summerville Campus and provides the necessary resources. Pray for the families who will be impacted for a lifetime with this new facility. Pray that more people will be able to experience the power and presence of God.

VISION PROJECT 2 GREENVILLE CAMPUS PERMANENT FACILITY

The Greenville Campus launched in 2004 and has had 5 different locations in 15 years. We currently meet in a private school facility and have limited access to the space except for Sunday morning services. Our volunteers set up the church every weekend and then tear it all down again. We cannot establish permanent signage and generally lack the visibility needed. The space is barely functional and does not reflect the commitment to excellence that Seacoast Church represents. The auditorium is small, making response time difficult for all the people who call our campus “home.”

Without a space accessible 24/7, we are unable to minister to the needs of the community as consistently and regularly as necessary. Our campus offices are also a mile and a half from the school. We would like to house our offices at the same location as the church. Although we have been ministering in Greenville for 15 years, the lack of permanent space communicates doubt about our commitment to the city. We want people to understand we are here to stay, and we will see our city transformed.

We are looking for an existing facility that can serve as our forever home, but new construction will also be considered if necessary.

Pray for an existing facility that provides 24/7 space to minister to those who call this campus home. Help us to find the correct location and sufficient finances, and for the team to have God's guidance during the search process.



VISION PROJECT 3 JOHNS ISLAND CAMPUS PERMANENT FACILITY

We have combined our James and Johns Island Campuses to make the best use of our resources and to position us to grow in the future. The combined campus meets at the Charleston Collegiate School on Johns Island, but we believe 24/7 space is needed to effectively minister to those who call this campus home. Throughout the history of both of the island campuses, our teams have had to set up and tear down weekly and store supplies in containers located onsite, which has severely limited capacity to grow our church family.

The Johns Island Campus serves the James Island, Johns Island, Folly, Kiawah, and Seabrook areas. A permanent home will position this campus with exponential growth potential. We are looking to purchase an existing facility that will expand our ministry and outreach opportunities, but construction will be considered if necessary.

Pray that our team finds a central location that has the visibility the campus needs, and the vision to renovate a facility that will allow us to continue our ministry to the surrounding communities.

VISION PROJECT 4 MANNING CAMPUS NEW FACILITY RENOVATION

Our Manning Campus purchased a building in April 2019 for \$360,000. We have leased the building until May 2022 to an outside entity, an arrangement that will result in \$43,800 per year being applied to the purchase cost of the building. At the end of the lease, we will start the renovation. Once we move into the building, we will no longer have the \$30,000 per year expense of a weekend venue rental.

Pray that God would entrust us with this new building to expand our ministries and better serve the community.

VISION PROJECT 5 SEACOAST MUSIC OPERATING COSTS

Seacoast Music is the songwriting and recording arm of Seacoast Church. God is the ultimate creator and his example is calling us to use our gifts and resources to bring beauty and goodness to a hurting world through music.

Seacoast Music's biggest needs aren't in physical infrastructure, but people. We continue to build our team internally as well as externally through contract collaborators. Our goal is to stay independent as a record label to ensure our culture remains true to that of Seacoast Church. To do this, we need to build a network of team members who can fulfill the roles that a major record label typically accomplishes.

To allow for more flexibility and resourcing, Seacoast Music would like to hire and/or contract in the areas of digital media, production, writing/recording, and outsourced publishing and administrative services. This would allow Seacoast's Creative team to focus on serving other essential ministries of the church, such as Custom, Kidscoast, Sisterhood, small groups, SEU Seacoast, and the weekend experience.

Pray that God would align the right team of contributors, and that our songwriting would be anointed, spirit-filled, scripturally-based, and would speak both locally and globally.



CELEBRATION HIGHLIGHTS:

A total of \$427,911 has been raised for Next Gen Projects.

- This semester, 9 students graduated from SEU Seacoast. Current students represent 6 Seacoast campuses.
- On SEU Preview Day, 85 potential students and their parents visited the campus, with families traveling from as far as Montana and Texas.
- Currently, 224 Custom Summer Camp scholarships have been awarded.
- During our child dedication services, parents dedicated 86 children to God.
- The Mount Pleasant Student Center will be undergoing initial renovations as part of a long-term plan.
- Nearly 3,000 middle and high school students have attended Custom One Night since services resumed.





VISION PROJECT 1
SEU SEACOAST FUND FOR ANNUAL OPERATING COSTS



SEU Seacoast is a regional campus for Southeastern University (Lakeland, FL) and an educational arm of Seacoast Church that launched in 2017. We offer 10 different degree options. In addition to students gaining their academic degrees, they serve in practicums all across Seacoast departments and campuses. In 2020, SEU Seacoast moved all classrooms into

the Mount Pleasant Campus facility. The operating costs of SEU Seacoast include staffing and student housing, and programmatic essentials, such as practicum costs, student life events, recruiting events, and mission trips.

Pray that God will continue to give direction to the leadership of SEU Seacoast and Southeastern University, and that students will thrive academically and spiritually in their practicums.


VISION PROJECT 2
MOUNT PLEASANT CAMPUS WON BY ONE AND CHILDREN'S MINISTRY SPACE ADDITION

Prior to COVID-19, the children's environments reached maximum capacity for weekend services and events. Our long-term plans include providing additional space for our special needs ministry and our nursery areas. The appropriate timing for this expansion is being determined.

Pray for children to experience the love of Christ in these new classrooms. Pray also for the architects and engineers as they design state-of-the-art classrooms for our kids.

VISION PROJECT 3 SEU SEACOAST SCHOLARSHIP FUND

If a student desires to have a Christian higher education option for their college experience, it usually includes incredibly high costs. Southeastern University has



drastically reduced the tuition costs for our regional campus, but there are still expenses that hinder students from being able to attend. A student interested in attending SEU Seacoast can use financial aid options, including Pell grants, private outside scholarships, and loan options. However, due to Southeastern University's main campus being located in Lakeland, Florida, students cannot use the South Carolina scholarship money

available. Therefore, having legacy scholarship money available for academically strong, or special-circumstance students, would be an incredible blessing for SEU Seacoast.

We would like to provide 14 student scholarships this year.

Pray that we would gain favor within the South Carolina higher education commission for our local students to be able to use SC state scholarship money, and that finances wouldn't prevent any students from attending SEU Seacoast.

VISION PROJECT 4 SUMMERVILLE CAMPUS WON BY ONE RENOVATION

During regular weekend services prior to COVID-19, the Summerville Campus serves 12-22 children in its Won by One, special needs ministry. These children range in age from 3 to 16. The group has more than doubled in size since 2019, which also has required the expansion of our Dream Team who serve in the ministry.

In the current Won by One environment, we would like to set up zones within the room to address students' various sensory needs and help them feel comfortable

and welcome. We want to offer the children the opportunity to hear the gospel of Jesus, to enjoy a time of worship and praise, and to join in as part of a small group community in a way that is meaningful to each child. Additional ministry opportunities for Won by One will be included in the plan for the new campus location.

VISION PROJECT 5 MOUNT PLEASANT CAMPUS CUSTOM MINISTRY SPACE RENOVATION

In April of 2019, our Student Ministry moved from the Warehouse into our former Worship Center. Attendance at the weekend student service grew by 31 percent. While there is still capacity in the Student Center during regularly scheduled services, this former space has had no significant updates for 20 years.



We are currently working on updating some interior finishes, colors, and graphics. We will also be replacing the chairs in the near future. The conversion from sanctuary to a Student Ministry area will take time, vision, and continued development. We believe effective Student Ministry provides three different environments: spiritual space, relational space, and physical space. Spiritual space provides an environment for students to worship. Relational space helps facilitate small groups and cultivate relationships.

Physical space allows for recreation and play. In this space, we also envision creating multi-purpose classrooms and relational space for our Southeastern University program.

To help visualize this renovation, we've partnered with Novus Architects to design a concept for renovating the 12,000 sq. ft. space. We have completed a series of concepts, but the final design is still in development and a timeframe for renovations has yet to be determined.

Pray that we are able to design and fund an attractional environment that maximizes spiritual, relational and intellectual growth for our students.



VISION PROJECT 6 CUSTOM SUMMER CAMP SCHOLARSHIP FUND

So many middle school and high school students' lives are changed at Summer Camp. It's one of our most important student ministry opportunities, and we never want the cost of camp to be the reason students can't attend. Summer Camp scholarships allow more students the chance to find God, grow their faith, and build lasting relationships in a fun environment.

Seacoast Local Missions is committed to making a difference. Through Dream Centers, benevolence, and local partnerships, we are fighting poverty, seeking justice and giving hope in our communities. Our focus areas are education, health, homelessness, foster care, safe environments, and compassion and empowerment. Seacoast has spent more than \$2.8M on local, national and global missions over this last challenging year.

CELEBRATION HIGHLIGHTS:

Through your generous giving, \$661,500 has been raised for Local Missions projects.

- More than 8,246 individuals have received assistance from our Lowcountry food pantries.
- The Summerville Campus is launching a Car Care ministry, completing oil changes and other safety repairs for single parents and others experiencing financial hardship.
- The North Charleston E3 Student Mentoring program has 68 students partnered with mentors. The 25 mentees who met their semester goals celebrated with a trip to the Atlanta Aquarium.
- This past winter, Seacoast volunteers served the homeless population at the Charleston Warming Center, providing meals, warm beds, and prayer.
- Healing Farms received funding for a new van to transport students with disabilities to day programs, summer camp, and special gatherings.
- Ohana Makana Prison Ministry received support to provide inmates with plumbing and horticultural vocational training. Seacoast weekend messages impact over 4,000 inmates.
- Funding for Charleston Hope provides local Title 1 schools with classroom supplies, mentors, and four summer food distributions, and promotes girls' empowerment initiatives.
- Communities in Schools (CIS) received program support to promote students staying in school. CIS serves nearly 8,000 students in 15 Charleston and Berkeley County schools.
- Our Dream Center Clinic served over 530 patients this quarter.
- The North Charleston Dream Center installed sports flooring and provided much-needed equipment to support our food pantries and Dream Centers.





VISION PROJECT 1
SEACOAST DREAM CENTER CLINIC
OPERATING BUDGETS



Seacoast operates Dream Centers at the North Charleston and West Ashley Campuses. These Dream Centers provide resources and opportunities to low-income, homeless, and under-served individuals and families. Just a few of the available resources and opportunities include our food pantries and clothes closets, street ministry, and our clinics. Our clinics may provide twelve types of specialty care, dental and vision care, as well as lab and diagnostic care, and a medication

program at no cost to patients who lack access to insurance and are living 200 percent below the Federal Poverty Level.

Our Dream Clinics served over 530 patients this quarter. Recently, the West Ashley clinic recommended a new patient go to the ER, where she then received treatment that saved her life.

Pray for our pastors, staff, and Dream Team as they serve those in greatest need in our community. Pray for wisdom, discernment, and strength. Pray that the Dream Center is an open door to share God's love.

VISION PROJECT 2
NORTH CHARLESTON DREAM CENTER EXPANSION

Seacoast planted the Dream Center in North Charleston in 2007, when the city was one of the most dangerous in the country. The Dream Center offers resources and opportunities to families in desperate need of hope. Each year, its clinic serves over 6,000 patients and the Dream House serves as an educational hub for the community by providing GED and ESL classes to over 100 student per semester. Additionally, the Dream Pantry and Dream Closet serve over 19,000 people, while the Adopt-a-Block program serves nearly 3,200 people each month. In the areas where Adopt-a-Block is active, crime has fallen more than 75 percent. Recently, the North Charleston Dream Center installed sports flooring and provided much-needed equipment to support our food pantries and Dream Centers.

We are considering two options for this expansion:

1. Purchase the two lots adjacent to the current Dream Center in order to expand the facility.
2. Purchase an existing facility in North Charleston to serve as a secondary location that can extend Seacoast's outreach to additional communities.

Pray that God would continue to use Seacoast and the Dream Center to be a beacon of light in this community. Pray for wisdom as we continue to explore opportunities to best serve the surrounding areas.



VISION PROJECT 3 MULTIPLE CAMPUS E3 MENTORING PROGRAM

The e3 mentoring program matches at-risk youth (third grade through high school) with professional and community mentors on a one-on-one basis. Through this partnership, mentors come alongside single parents in need. Mentors teach life skills and engage with mentees in everyday life activities, such as going to the beach or a baseball game. Mentees can earn points throughout the year that enable them to participate in two seasonal trips to places like Carowinds and Washington, D.C. Mentees also have the opportunity to earn admission to Custom Summer Camp. At the North Charleston Dream Center, over 80 students annually receive mentoring, and the average graduation rate since inception is over 90 percent. Last year, it was 100 percent.

We hired a director and are working to replicate the program at other campuses, such as the West Ashley and James and Johns Island Campuses.

Pray for the e3 program expansion to other campuses and for continued fostering of God-ordained relationships between mentors and students. Pray for current conversations with local government on how we can partner together to make a bigger impact together.

Seacoast has spent more than \$2.8M on local, national and global missions over this last challenging year.

CELEBRATION HIGHLIGHTS:

A total of \$470,773 was raised for National Missions Projects.

- Pastors Collective: In partnership with the Wesleyan Investment Foundation, Seacoast acquired 66 acres in Charleston. The Retreat at Church Creek offers world-class fishing, and 2.5 miles of trails and peaceful landscapes. In the first two months, we hosted 5 teams, consisting of 75 pastors and business leaders from 23 states, and held a Seacoast Leaders retreat. Over the summer, additional retreats for pastors as well as for pastors' wives will be held.
- We planted 30 churches in the U.S. this year through the Association of Related Churches (ARC). To date, 962 churches have been planted.
- Convoy of Hope and Christ in Action received funding for winter storms disaster relief.
- Seacoast provided sponsorships to the Refuge Foundation for pastors' renewal, revitalization and recalibration.
- A21 and Trafficking Hope received funding to help fight human trafficking.



VISION PROJECT 1 CHURCH PLANTING THROUGH THE ASSOCIATION OF RELATED CHURCHES



The Association of Related Churches (ARC) was co-founded by Greg Surratt to be an association of churches working with church planters and church leaders. To date, ARC has planted 962 local churches and has networks in Canada, China, Ireland, Holland, Australia, and South Africa. Over \$30 million a year is donated to missions through ARC churches.

As a part of Seacoast's commitment to church planting through ARC, we provide support, guidance, and resources to continue to launch life-giving churches. ARC is immersed in developing new best practices for online church, and is updating all church-planting curricula. This new curricula will be used to train couples as church planters.

VISION PROJECT 2 PASTORS COLLECTIVE

The Pastors Collective exists to help pastors avoid and recover from burnout by offering strategic events, challenging podcasts, and opportunities for important conversations. The Collective is in the process of forming a nonprofit and developing a website and other infrastructure. One of our goals is to host retreats for 100 pastors this year.

In partnership with the Wesleyan Investment Foundation, Seacoast acquired 66 acres in Charleston. The Retreat at Church Creek offers world-class fishing, and 2.5 miles of trails and peaceful landscapes. In the first two months, we hosted 5 teams, consisting of 75 pastors and business leaders from 23 states, and held a Seacoast Leaders retreat. We believe the local church is the hope of the world. It is our desire to see life-giving churches in every community fighting hard to alleviate spiritual and physical poverty. Seacoast Global Missions continues to partner with exceptional churches or church-focused organizations in 10 countries to help them fulfill the vision that God has given them to reach their communities. We provide encouragement and support for church planting, leadership development, social impact (health and education), and economic development initiatives. Seacoast has spent more than \$2.8M on local, national and global missions over this last challenging year.

CELEBRATION HIGHLIGHTS:

For our Global Missions projects, \$479,858 has been raised.

- Sri Lanka: Funds support pastors at Bethany Church to help offset the impact of COVID-19. A much-needed outreach vehicle was also purchased.
- India: Seacoast participated in a women's conference in West Bengal through video teachings, and provided funds for COVID-19 relief supplies in the wake of the recent, devastating outbreak.
- Pakistan: Cross-Connecting Network and ARC Pakistan received funding for the training of 1,000 pastors and leaders through the ARC Pakistan Conference.
- Togo: Funds for Francis + Benedict's new building renovation will help provide a place for seamstresses to work, store fabrics, and host future teams.
- South Africa: Emoyeni received 3-years' support for a pastor at a new church plant. They also received sound equipment and general operating funds to offset losses during COVID-19.
- Honduras: Seacoast helped plant 5 new churches and provided funding for Prisoners of Hope Prison Ministry that serves over 4,000 inmates, police officers, and prison personnel through discipleship, training, and special events.
- Nicaragua: Christ For the City Nicaragua ministry team received support for their local church training programs and feeding center.
- Water Missions: Funds support safe water programs as well as the Global Water Center recently launched to promote collaboration and the sharing of best practices and resources among organizations working to end the global water crisis.
- Medical Missions International: Funding will help establish and support affordable, quality health care centers in developing countries.
- Good News Prison Ministry: Seacoast provided sponsorships to chaplains working in jails and prisons in 22 states, 1 American territory, and 25 countries.
- Church Asia: Support for the "Rohi" project in Asia will help create a video and Bible school app in 3 languages. The goal is to enroll 1,000 pastors this summer.

GLOBAL CHURCH PLANTING

Pioneers Togo, Togo

Seacoast has been in partnership with Pioneers Togo for nearly 20 years. Togo is one of the smallest, poorest, and most overlooked countries in Africa. Within a population of 7 million, 29 percent are Christian, while the predominate religions in the rural areas are Islam, Voodoo, and other indigenous beliefs. Pioneers has planted 154 churches/Discovery groups among 13 people groups and is working in 84 rural villages. Their goal is to plant 15 new village churches and secure pastor support. Pioneers Togo also broadcasts a weekly radio program that provides messages of salvation and hope. Their goal is to plant 15 new village churches and secure pastor support.

This is due primarily to waterborne diseases and a lack of medical care.

Pioneers is looking to provide access to clean drinking water in villages. They are working to improve the quality of life and health in these villages.

lasting change, but for some time, natural disasters, political turmoil and civil unrest have sent them into “relief mode.” It’s important for their communities’ self-development to move out of relief and into a period of restoration as quickly as possible. 410 Bridge’s current response to the impact, countrywide, of COVID is to help communities safely restart businesses, and reopen schools and churches over the coming months.

410 Bridge plans to establish an economic development program to include a fishing business initiative (to include the purchase of a fishing boat and supplies, and the construction of a cold room for storage).

Bethany is committed to church planting and reaching their nation for Christ. Many of their pastors lack transportation. Bethany would like to provide 6 lead pastors with motorbikes so they can reach and better serve their communities.

Their profits are used to resource community leaders in Togo, enabling them to continue projects that benefit orphans, widows, and those suffering in poverty. In February of 2020, F+B purchased a building/warehouse for the seamstresses to work, for materials to be stored, and for housing future teams. Phase I of building renovations is complete. The seamstresses have moved in. Phase II will provide housing on the second floor, updated plumbing, paint, and furniture.
