Reflect

During the Michael Jordan era, the Chicago Bulls roster had all kinds of different athletes who brought their unique talents to the court. Similarly, the Church is made up of people from different backgrounds, who all come together for one purpose – to reach people for Christ. No sports team is built to last, but it doesn't have to be that way for the church.

How To Build A Team That Lasts

1. Choose To Be A Role Player

- a. When you look at your team (family, work, church) are you valuing the differences of the people around you, or are you surrounding yourself with people who have similar gifts?
- b. What's your role on that team? How are you contributing to the team's success?
- c. Why do you think Jesus chose people of different backgrounds to be part of his disciples?
- d. How do we become the role player on a team that will last forever?

2. Learn to trust our teammates

- a. What can we learn about being a healthy church by getting uncomfortable in all kinds of situations?
- b. Where do you need to learn to trust your teammates?
- c. In what area of your life are you taking all the shots?
- d. Pastor Josh said "we're a better church when we have a broad range of perspectives." How does that apply to you?
